JOB PREPARATION TRAINING WORKSHOPS

CV, Cover Letter and Job Search

FINANCIAL LITERACY WORKSHOPS

Economics for Success Young Adults 15+

Prepare for the world of work with insights on the right financial tools to thrive.

This very popular program leads students through a reflection on the importance of continued education, life after high school as well as what's needed to succeed in today's workforce. Payroll deductions and taxes will help students understand how their work helps pay for public infrastructure and services. Students will create a budget to help prepare them for the financial reality of postsecondary life.

Dollars with Sense Young Adults 15+

Learn how to make smart financial decisions , live debt-free and become a savvy investor.

This exceptional program teaches students to understand the importance of setting goals, saving money and making smart decisions to manage their finances responsibly. With the help of games, students will learn how to avoid the pitfalls of credit and debt. They also learn about the history of money, the various forms of consumerism and budgeting money for a project.

WORKERS' LEGAL RIGHTS WORKSHOPS

Know your rights

"Can I be fired for taking a sick day?", "Is it legal to be paid in cash"?, "What are my rights after I lost my job?"

These questions and more will be answered in the "Know Your Rights" workshop. Participants in this interactive workshop will learn about what rights and responsibilities they and their employer have.

Expand your legal knowledge and competencies to identify situations of potential harassment in the workplace

Students become aware of harassment in the workplace through a quiz and scenarios. Demystify various legal concepts, such as harassment, intimidation and violence (including certain crimes: threats, assault, sexual assault and criminal harassment) They also learn about possible remedies and resources they can turn to if they experience or witness harassment
